8. Research

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Authorship Learning

Conducting interviews and analyzing online collaboration with the eight students who recently wrote and authored a book about MOOCs for their *Big Thinkers* class. We are trying to better understand the benefits of "Authorship Learning."

MSEd Information Technology Graduates in the workplace

Conducting interviews and site observations with MSEd InfoTech graduates in their workplaces to better understand how the skills we teach in the program align with needs in the workplace.

Technology Use in Saudi Arabia vs. the U.S.

Working with Hind Alghanmi, a graduate of the MSEd InfoTech program and Assistant Professor of Education at Al Baha University in Saudi Arabia to better understand technology use, both socially and in education, by students in our two cultures. We will be surveying and interviewing students in our respective universities, looking for differences and similarities and evaluating ways we might inform one another.

Technology and Teaching in Remote Locations (2011-2012)

Conducted site visits and interviews with teachers in remote schools in Alaska in order to determine how remoteness influences teachers' ability to instruct students in remote locations and how technology can alleviate issues raised by remoteness.

Educational Technology Oregon Principals Survey (2012)

Surveyed principals to better understand the educational technology environment in K12 schools where WOU Education students work and do their student teaching. Data has been analyzed and is being used to improve educational technology coursework in the College of Education, identify strengths and weaknesses in the educational technology coursework provided for undergraduate education majors, and better understand the market for graduates of this MSEd Information Technology degree program.

MSEd Information Technology Graduate Survey (2012)

Surveyed all graduates of the redesigned MSEd Information Technology to determine the effectiveness of the design and delivery of the program. This will be an ongoing project, with surveys conducted every two years.

Cultural differences in perceptions of plagiarism (2008)

Surveyed WOU faculty, non-international graduate students, and international graduate students to determine how they define plagiarism and to examine differences between their beliefs and their behaviors. Results from this study were used to design a process for proactively addressing plagiarism issues in the MSEd Information Technology program. Preliminary results were presented in Glasgow, Scotland at the Improving University Teaching conference, July 2008.

Professional development in technology integration: needs of Oregon K-12 educators (2008) Surveyed Oregon teachers, and interviewing district technology specialists to determine educational needs and interest in a Master's degree program. Results were used to design a revised MSEd Information Technology degree program.

Technology integration study (2006-7)

Collected surveys from students in the WOU undergraduate teacher education program to determine whether they are incorporating technology into their work samples, and if so, how.

Graphic organizer study (2006-7)

Does the tool for creating a graphic organizer influence the structure depicted in a systematic way? Compared graphic organizers created by hand versus those created using Inspiration.

"Students as Teachers: Service-learning collaborations between schools and museums or visitor facilities." (2004-5).

Collected case-stories of service-learning projects where students conduct research and create interpretive materials to educate the public about our natural and cultural heritage. These projects could involve collaboration with a museum, visitor center, aquarium, national park — any organization that provides educational information to the public — and can involve researching and designing signs or exhibits, signed nature trails, educational brochures, guided walks, traveling exhibits, educational websites, special educational events, or any number of other educational products.

"Survey of Technology Use in Public Schools in the Willamette Valley, Oregon." (2004-5) Includes a survey of all principals in schools where WOU student teachers are mentored to determine how technology is used in the schools. Follow-up interviews with individual teachers to document best practices.

"Online classes: the student experience." (2003)

Qualitative study of student perceptions of the effort and benefits involved in an online learning experience, and the implications for improving design of online courses.
