



he world must embark on the biggest period of change we have ever known. Citizens, local governments and businesses know what needs to change, but often don't know what to do. Since the early 1980s, a small but growing group of permaculture initiatives, groups and networks have been pioneering new approaches to food, energy, housing and community, and now more than ever, we need to share that work and inspire a huge new wave of permaculture action across Europe.

The Permaculture Association (Britain) has taken on the mantle of hosting the European Permaculture Convergence (EUPC) in 2021, Saturday 8th to Sunday 17th October 2021. The EUPC will be an online event, curated by national, regional and local organisations from across the continent, sharing a variety of sessions and workshops as well as broadcasting pre-recorded tours of permaculture projects. Multilingual content will ensure there are opportunities for wide participation.

Topics range from action on climate change to community, supporting refugees and regenerative agriculture. Contributions will come from experienced practitioners and younger contributors alike. Popular content around self-sufficiency and gardening will help reach a wider audience and for the people working in the field for longer there will be deep dive sessions and strategic meetings focused on the development of permaculture in Europe.

The steering group for the event currently has members from five nations with further collaboration and programming offered from groups as far apart as Ukraine, Latvia, Serbia and Norway. The aim is to create something diverse and accessible which seeds the building of a stronger European Permaculture Network and a renewed cross-border community.



Youth in Permaculture

Earth Care, People Care, and Fair Share was the Youth in Permaculture response to the challenge posed throughout the COVID-19 pandemic and the associated closures, curfews and restrictions. At a time when many young people are suffering from anxiety and frustration, Youth in Permaculture has been building a permaculture demonstration site, providing workshops and a safe and healing place for people to come and share work, stories, food and support. When restrictions allow, they plant gardens, provide outdoor classrooms and workshops for school groups, youth groups, and others needing to spend time in Nature with their hands in the healing soil. Supported through an Erasmus Solidarity grant and guided through Permacultura Mediterránea (PermaMed.org) the Youth in Permaculture chapter in Spain (Jóvenes en Permacultura) also created videos for the online Sembrares global seminar on International Permaculture Day. The goal is to inspire other young people to build inner and outer resilience through Earth Care, People Care, regenerating gardens and sharing a supportive and inspiring permaculture community. https://youthinpermaculture.org
